IN THE COMMITTEE

In the session of the Committee of Supply in Room 254, on Monday, May 14, 2001, considering the estimates of the Department of Conservation, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mr. MAGUIRE recommending that the Minister of Conservation's salary be donated toward infrastructure development aimed at ensuring the safety of Manitobans' drinking water. Whereupon a counted vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated (17-28).
