WHEREAS Earth day was April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021; and

WHEREAS Manitoba's parks have provided a reprieve from the stress of the COVID-19 pandemic;

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WHEREAS provincial parks are an asset that can never be taken for granted; and

WHEREAS the value and importance of provincial parks has never been clearer; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has invested in enhancing provincial parks, ensuring that parks remain accessible to all Manitobans through a \$20 million endowment fund; and

WHEREAS the endowment fund is additional funding meant to offset the changing demands and increased costs of enhancing and sustaining the parks; and

WHEREAS the preservation and upkeep of provincial parks is a key part of the Made-in-Manitoba Climate and Green Plan, to see that improvements and program continues well into the future; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has made significant progress with its Made-in-Manitoba Climate and Green Plan to mitigate climate change including: the implementation of biofuel regulations which exceed the federal mandate; the establishment of a five-year Carbon Savings Account system; the increase in the Conservation and Climate fund; and the creation of \$102 million Conservation Trust and a \$108 million Growing Outcomes and Watersheds and Wetlands Trust to promote conservation of natural areas.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba acknowledge the undeniable importance of Manitoba's provincial parks and urge the Provincial Government to ensure that they remain accessible to all Manitobans.

Mr. BUSHIE – To urge the Minister of Health and Seniors Care to open a genuine four bed Epilepsy Unit, similar to the one recently opened in Saskatchewan, at the Health Sciences Centre with modern equipment and adequate epilepsy neurosurgeons, neurologists, nurses, clerks and technicians; and to formally establish an Epilepsy Program to ensure that all epilepsy staff can deliver care to patients in a coordinated fashion.

Hon. Mr. GERRARD – To urge the Provincial Government to provide financing for upgrades to the cochlear implant covered under Medicare, or provide funding assistance through the Cochlear Implant Speech Processor Replacement Program, to assist with the replacement costs associated with a device upgrade.

Mr. MALOWAY – To urge the Provincial Government to immediately contact all home and property owners in Manitoba with lead water pipes connecting to the City watermain line, and provide full financial support to them for lead water pipe replacement so their access to clean water is assured and exposure to lead and its health risks are eliminated.
