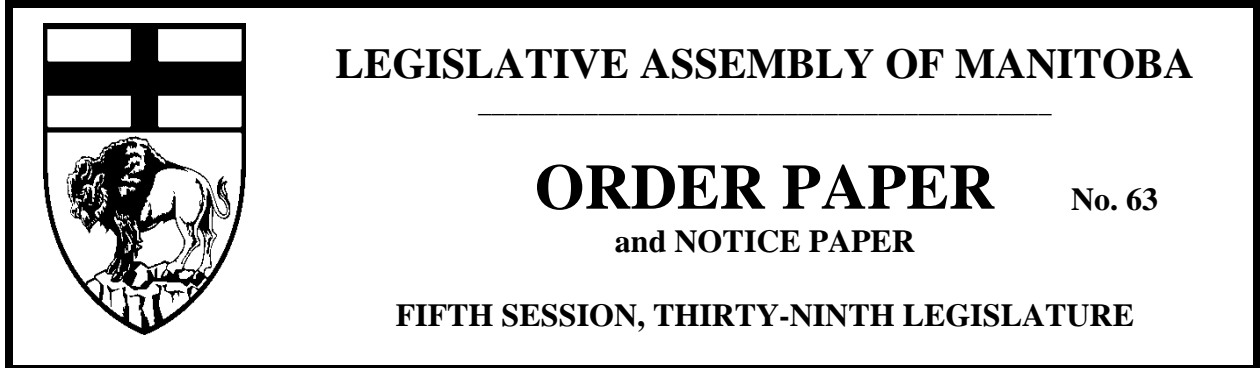

17. In choosing a route for Bipole III, will private landowners be offered an easement or outright purchase of land for the right of way and how will land values for either an easement or purchase be determined?
18. Manitoba Hydro has stated publicly it is not able to use expropriation as a tool for determining right of ways. Will the Government of Manitoba expropriate privately held land on behalf of Manitoba Hydro for Bipole III if landowners are unable to reach suitable terms with Manitoba Hydro?
19. What will be the minimum separation distance between Bipole III and residences, yard sites, and livestock operations?
20. What are Manitoba Hydro's criteria for determining effects on livestock from Bipole III?
21. What is the effect on cellular phone service, GPS guidance systems, and other electronic equipment in proximity to Bipole III?

PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

Mr. REID – Continued Expansion of Personal Care Homes and Long-Term Care Services

20. WHEREAS Manitoba saw health services drastically cut during the 1990s when the current leader of the Official Opposition was a chief advisor to the then Progressive Conservative Provincial Government; and

WHEREAS these cuts included the loss of over 1,000 nurses, new home care user fees and failed attempts to privatize home care service delivery; and

WHEREAS the current Provincial Government in Manitoba has made health care a priority since 1999, including expanding supports and living options for seniors; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has worked to expand long term care options for seniors including: the addition of over 930 personal care homes and supportive housing beds across Manitoba since 1999; an expansion of home care to thousands more Manitobans and; the creation of new supports for thousands of seniors in group living to help them remain safely at home with the help they need; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government recently announced a renewed long term care strategy that builds on these achievements with stronger home care, additional rehabilitation supports-and a new \$200 million construction fund to add hundreds of personal care home beds across the province; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government strategy for the addition of more personal care home beds would be put at risk by adopting Conservative opposition plans announced by the Leader of the Official Opposition to limit health spending to the rate of economic growth, cutting over \$750 million from this year's health budget alone.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Legislative Assembly commend the Provincial Government for its aggressive plan to expand long-term care options for all Manitobans; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Legislative Assembly be urged to recognize the need for more long term care supports in Transcona and throughout the province.
