

## THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF MANITOBA

2:30 o'clock, Friday, July 16, 1971

MR. SPEAKER: The Honourable the House Leader.

MR. GREEN: Mr. Speaker, we have not reached the end of our delegations in Municipal Affairs Committee, and therefore we would like to go back into Municipal Affairs Committee with the Mace still on the table and the House in session; with the expectation that we will be finishing sometime this afternoon and be back in the House later this afternoon at the usual call of the buzzer.

MR. SPEAKER: Thank you. In that case I'll be leaving the House to return at the will of the Assembly.

Sitting resumed.

MR. GREEN: The Committee on Municipal Affairs is now concluding its work. It has got its last brief presented and we didn't want to wait till it's finished because we want to be in the House before 5:30.

I want to confirm with honourable members that the proposed procedure now is that we will have the House meet in regular sitting tonight at 8:00 o'clock, that we would proceed with the routine business - the third reading of bills which can be expected to proceed without any controversy; the introduction of bills on second reading which are on the Order Paper; and then to adjourn the House until Monday, with Law Amendments Committee sitting tonight and at least tomorrow morning; and I'm not sure about the afternoon. So that was the only purpose in coming back, Mr. Speaker; unless any other honourable member wished to make any comment, I'd be prepared to move the adjournment.

Mr. Speaker, I would move, seconded by the Honourable the Attorney-General, that the House do now adjourn.

MR. SPEAKER presented the motion and after a voice vote declared the motion carried and the House adjourned until 8 p.m. tonight.
